We would like to remind residents that all trees in Chorltonville have a preservation order. Any tree that is greater than 11cm diameter at 150cm height will need permission from the council for its felling or pruning. Please refer to the council's website for further information.

The committee will have to repair some recent damage to lampposts from sticky tape that was used to secure notices regarding a found cat. Please refrain from directly sellotaping items to a lamppost as the paint comes off. The lectern in the Meade can be used to display such notices. We also would like to urge any residents who place such notices to be mindful and to remove them promptly when it is appropriate.
