

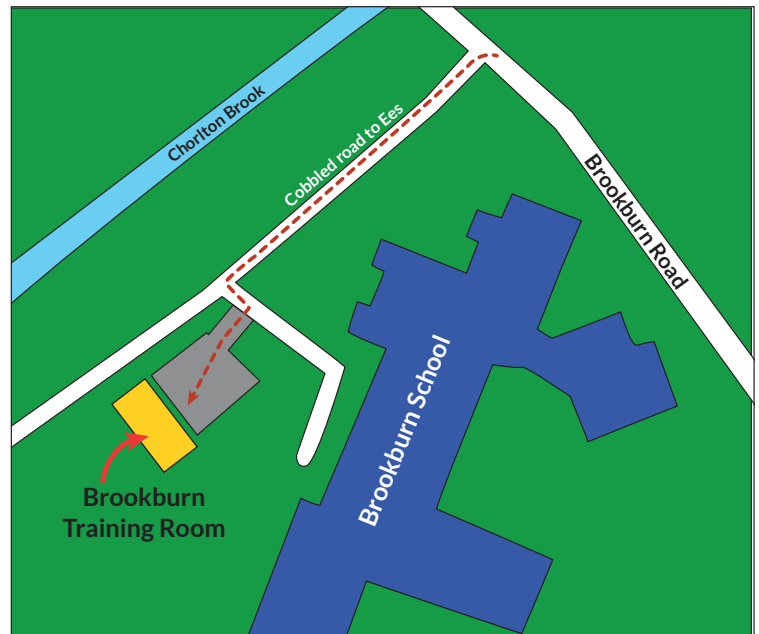


# AGM 2026 Reminder

## Low Water Pressure

We've had low water pressure in Chorltonville for decades. North West Water (United Utilities' predecessors) told us the supply pipe network was so old that increased pressure would only result in more burst pipes.

(Water pressure is considered low if it takes longer than 6 or 7 seconds to fill a 1 litre jug.)

Clearly, United Utilities would prefer not to incur the inevitably substantial cost of upgrading the supply pipes throughout the Ville. And from residents' perspective any systemic upgrade would of course be disruptive and could damage our trees' roots. So for now the solution seems to be fix by fix.

The Committee can do little to influence United Utilities about this but if enough residents are concerned about their low water pressure, individual representations from several residents may carry more weight.
